
The phrase "labor of love" describes perfectly the 110% commitment of our church staff to the ministry of First Presbyterian Church and I invite you to join with me in giving thanks for all they do. Working in our church is a "calling" for each one of us and I am thankful each day for the opportunity God has given me to serve with these "saints" whose love and faith inspire me to want to serve even more. When there is a task to be done, one response that you never hear is, "that's not in my job description." When there's a problem to be solved, the solution is found through collaborative teamwork, not "everyone for him/herself." When a challenge seems insurmountable, we encourage each other and pray. Yes – serving FPC is a "labor of love" and I invite you to pray for us each day as we minister with you for the glory of God.

Often, the "labor" that happens at the church has an "out-of-sight" dimension, with tasks being done and no one knowing who accomplished them. For instance, did you know that:

- -Randy comes earlier than anyone to open the church each weekday morning. As the walkers arrive, he has already worked several hours. He usually is one of the final people to leave the church in the evening.
- -David continues to inspire younger musicians through lessons and encouragement, helping them to understand the piano and its potential to make beautiful music.
- -Michele spends at least 20 minutes each morning greeting and talking with the walkers, patiently listening to them and helping each person to feel special.
- Jennifer balances all that she does with a smile and the most positive attitude imaginable. She helps to account for the financial support the church receives and keeps all expenditures "in-order." She knows that attention to detail provides the best path to success.
- -Karen and Mary (Child Development Center) manage the entire CDC staff and program while giving each child (91 total) the love and attention he/she deserves. They also find time to drive the CDC van for school pickup, vacuum floors in the evening, and substitute when needed.

Truly, the staff of FPC loves our jobs and we thank you for inviting us to labor with you for the glory of God.
